### Anticipatory Governance and Sustainability meet in Phoenix

How can the City of Phoenix embrace anticipatory governance and take sustainability seriously? Sustainability and anticipatory governance are broad guiding principles for urban policies and actions that cope with the loss of economic opportunities, increasing infrastructure requirements, issues of resource scarcity and contamination, climate change impacts, poverty, technology access inequities, and violence from a proactive and integrated perspective. The City of Phoenix is currently crafting their *General Plan*, which provides long-range and cross-sectoral guidance for the city administration and addresses issues such as energy, housing, neighborhoods, public facilities, natural resources, transportation, and land use. A broad coalition of ASU researchers (faculty and students) are in the midst of working out a collaborative research and teaching project with the City of Phoenix to provide meaningful insights into anticipatory sustainability governance that can inform the drafting and continuous adaptation of the *General Plan*.
